Warm Homes on Prescription Scheme
Easington Primary Care Trust, in partnership with the District of Easington Council, are providing warmer homes on prescription to people with cold-related ill health problems by making them a priority for home insulation.

## Summarv

The Warmer Homes on Prescription scheme aims to reduce the incidence of cold-related diseases, such as arthritis, in Easington, Country Durham, through providing warm homes for patients suffering from such illnesses. The scheme is led by Easington Primary Care Trust (PCT), and allows GPs and other medical professionals to make referrals for patients suffering from cold-related problems to have their homes insulated by Easington Council as a priority. The PCT has contributed funding for insulation to be fitted, allowing the council to act faster to insulate the homes of patients referred by the scheme.

In addition to the health benefits gained from better insulated and subsequently warmer homes, patients may also experience reduced heating bills through reduced fuel use. Good insulation can lead to a decrease in fuel use, which has additional positive impacts on the environment, by reducing pollution and carbon emissions. Improving the health of people suffering from coldrelated illness reduces avoidable need for healthcare within Easington and frees up resources to be used for health improvement schemes such as Warmer Homes.

Since the initial pilot of the campaign at six GP surgeries in Easington in 2003, the scheme has been so successful that it has been expanded to all GP surgeries and Social Services teams in Easington.

## **Strategic Learning**

- Partnership working and a shared vision between Easington PCT, the District of Easington Council and Easington GP surgeries has been vital to the success of the scheme.
- Enabling GPs and healthcare professionals to influence wider determinants of health, such as housing, can improve the health of the local population and make best use of NHS resources.
