Office of National Statistics (ONS)

A small Department that gathers economic and social statistics, ONS ranked top in our scoring having met 75% of targets.

Department for Environment Food & Rural Affairs (Defra)

Responsible for embedding sustainable development across the UK Government. The Defra estate is large and diverse, with 149 office sites and 16,000 equivalent full time staff.

HM Treasury (HMT)

Responsible for formulating and implementing the Government's economic policy. The smallest of the Government estates. Sustainable Development Minister: John Healey MP



Inland Revenue (IR)

A large office-based estate. Although the Department is now part of HM Revenue and Customs, it reported separately for the 2004-5 SDiG year. (Minister - see HMCE)



Department for International Development (DFID)

Manages Britain's aid to poor countries. The estate is one of the smallest in terms of size and employees. Overseas offices were not included.

Department of Trade & Industry (DTI)

Aims to drive up UK productivity and competitiveness. A medium sized estate with 82 office sites and 11 non-office or mixed sites.


Ministry of Defence (MOD)

Third largest landowner in the country with responsibility for 240,000 hectares, representing 1% of the total area of the UK. Sustainable Development Minister: Don Touhig MP



Home Office (HO)

Responsible for the police in England and Wales, national security, the justice system and immigration. HM Prison Service covers 80% of its building area. Sustainable Development Minister: Andy Burnham MP



Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM)

Aims to create prosperous, inclusive and sustainable communities. A small staff, but large estate due to the size of the Fire Services College. Sustainable Development Minister: Baroness Andrews



HM Customs & Excise (HMCE)

Responsible for collecting tax revenue as well as paying tax credits and child benefit. Now merged with Inland Revenue. Large estate - 218 office-based sites and 139 non-office or mixed sites. Sustainable Development Minister:

HOW DEPARTMENTS WERE SCORED

Departments were scored against Framework targets where the deadline is passed, taking into account that not all targets are applicable. The ranking is absolute - i.e. a Department that is close to meeting the target (or has only met one part of it) is marked as not meeting the target.

What the stars mean: % of targets met, past the deadline. Percentages are calculated from lowest score of 30.8% by LOD.
Five stars: met 85% of targets and above
Four stars: met 70-84% of targets
Three stars: met 55-69% of targets
Two stars: met just 40-54% of targets
One star: met just 25-39% of targets

Department for Constitutional Affairs (DCA)
Upholding justice, rights and democracy - a large estate that includes the Courts Service and Law Tribunals. Estate encompasses 95 listed buildings. Sustainable Development Minister: Baroness Ashton



Department for Transport (DfT)

Focuses on delivering the Government's transport strategy. The estate is 'medium-sized' - i.e. 285,056m² and 15,668 full-time equivalent staff. Sustainable Development Minister: Karen Buck MP



Department for Education & Skills (DfES)

A relatively large estate but with a comparatively small number of staff. Schools and higher education establishments are not included. Sustainable Development Minister: Maria Eagle MP



Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS)

Includes the arts, libraries, sport and recreation. The estate covered by the Framework is small. The smallest of the 20 departments in terms of staff numbers. Sustainable Development Minister: James Purnell MP



Department for Work & Pensions (DWP)

Agencies include Job Centre Plus, the Child Support Agency, and the Health and Safety Executive. The third largest estate, with 1,750 office-based sites. Sustainable Development Minister: Lord Hunt



Department of Health (DH)

One of the smallest Departments in terms of estate size. It has 27 office-based sites and 3 non-office or mixed sites (excludes hospitals) Sustainable Development Minister:


Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO)

Responsible for Britain's overseas relations and foreign affairs. Overseas properties were not included in the Framework assessment and the UK estate is relatively small. Sustainable Development Minister: Ian Pearson MP



Cabinet Office (CO)

One of smallest Government Departments, responsible for coordinating policy and strategy across Departments. Sustainable Development Minister: Jim Murphy MP



The Law Officers' Departments (LOD)

Includes the Serious Fraud Office and Crown Prosecution Service. It is a medium sized estate. The Department failed to meet 75% of targets Sustainable Development Minister: Solicitor General, Mike O'Brien MP



Export Credit Guarantee Department (ECGD)

Helps the UK industry export overseas. Due to a major restructuring, the ECGD was unable to submit its completed questionnaire before the submission deadline. Sustainable Development Minister: Malcolm Wicks MP
